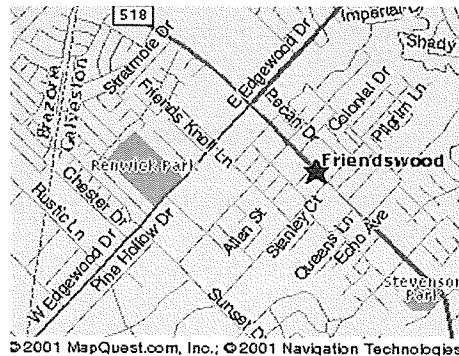
Donations & Memorials

Location

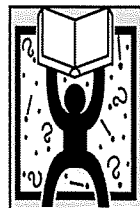
Friendswood Public Library is located at the corner of S. Friendswood Drive (FM 518) and Spreading Oaks.

Children's & Young Adult Services

The library holds storytimes for toddlers and preschoolers during the week. There are also additional programs throughout the year and a Summer Reading Program during the summer. A program schedule is available online and in the juvenile department.



OVERDUE FINES:

The fines on materials is \$0.10 per day with a maximum fine of \$5.00 per item per check out/renewal with the following exceptions:

\$0.25 per day

Board Games, CD players, DVDs, Hotspots, ILLs,
Laptops, Launchpads, New Books, Records, Tablets,
Take and Makes, Video Games

\$1.00 per day

Equipment, Projectors

LOST AND DAMAGED ITEMS:

The charge for lost or badly damaged materials is the replacement cost plus a non-refundable \$5.00 processing fee per item. Refunds will not be made on lost items after one year.

OTHER PENALTIES:

- ◆ When fines exceed \$100.00 per cardholder, borrowing privileges are suspended at all Galveston County Libraries.
- ◆ There will be a \$35.00 fee on all returned checks.

ACCESS TO COLLECTIONS:

Children (age 0-11) are limited to checking out items from the children's collection.

Young Adults (ages 12-17) are restricted from DVDs, Video Games, Board Games, Records, and all Tablets and Equipment

REFERENCE SERVICES:

Reference service is available from the reference desk, by telephone at **281-482-7135**, or by Internet through our website at www.friendswood.lib.tx.us.

Computer & Internet Services:

All computer services are available through sign-up at the reference desk. Use is limited to one hour. Patrons may call and schedule a usage time with the reference staff. Computers equipped with Microsoft® Word, Excel®, and PowerPoint®, DVD reader & writers, USB ports, and earphone connections. Printing is available for a fee of 10 cents per page for black & white and 50 cents per page for color, payable in cash.

Internet Services:

There are thirteen public access Internet stations available near the reference desk. Patrons must read and sign the library's Internet Access Policy before they may use the Internet. Patrons must also sign in at the reference desk before each use. Students under 16 years of age must have parental or guardian permission in order to use the library's Internet stations.

ADA Accessible Workstation:

The library also has one computer specifically designed for patrons with disabilities. It offers special software for the visually impaired. For information ask at Reference.

Computer Classes:

Classes are free and open to everyone. Courses focus primarily on Office products, internet usage and include a variety of special topics. Ask at Reference for more information.

Online Library Catalog:

The library's catalog is available at libcatalog.friendswood.com. Patrons may also view their patron profile, renew items, place items on hold, and check the status of their account. Requests for items or information may also be made through various forms found on the library's webpage.

Databases:

Access to full text articles on a wide range of subjects is available in the library and from your home computer. The databases available are:

- ◆ TexShare business, health, homework, history, genealogy, and literature
- ◆ Language learning and auto repair
