YOUTH SERVICES

- The Youth Services Department offered 421 programs for children and young adults last year.
- From Family Lego Hours to Storytimes, Outreach events around the City to an anime convention held in the building, our programs were attended by more than 24,000 patrons!
- Our Summer Reading Program encouraged a year long love of reading. 1,367 kids aged 0-18 read a logged a total 737,458 minutes of reading over the summer, earning them prizes and invitations to exclusive Library events.
- We continued partnering with Community organizations like the Galveston County Food Bank for Summer Kidz Pacz to keep kids fed over the summer, and Bay Area Alliance who generously provided monthly CLEAR Crates filled with free educational activities for all ages.
- The Teen Advisory Group took home several awards for their Lemonade Day Booth which raised money for our annual anime convention, Zaki Con.
- Zaki Con was bigger and better than ever, with more than 1,200 attendees and 40+ artists and vendor booths.



The library was one of 73 Texas public libraries to qualify for the Texas Municipal Library Directors Association "2023 Achievement of Library Excellence Award". The library demonstrated excellence in 10 service categories including underserved populations, summer reading, cultural and educational programming, and literacy support. Friendswood Library is in the top 15% of all public libraries in the state.
